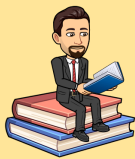
Weekly Tasks: Reading, Spellings, Times Tables

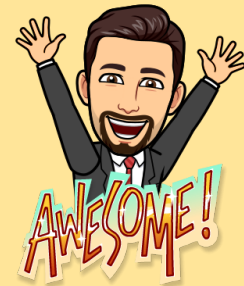
