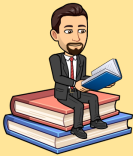
Weekly Tasks: Reading, Spellings, Times Tables

Please research the Peak District!

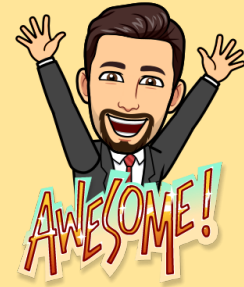
Can you find out key facts about the Peak District? Can you add maps and descriptions of the landscape? Ideas and websites below:

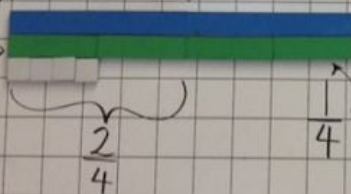
