



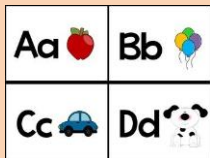

Perhaps they could write a sentence with these tricky words in? Can they spot the tricky words in books, stories online or in print in the environment?

Number of the week

Can your child identify this number? Can they count out the correct number of objects? Can they count on/back from this number? Can they tell you one more/one less or ten more/ten less? Can they find this number in the environment? How many different ways can they add together 2, 3 or 4 numbers to total this amount? Can they make this amount using coins? Can they share 17 into equal groups?
