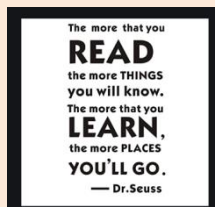
Ongoing Weekly English Tasks...

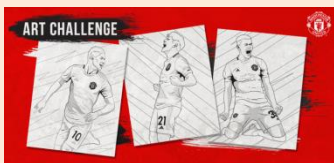

Best Bird Beak Birds' beaks have adapted to be the best shape to pick up the food they eat. Try using chopsticks, a spoon, a clothes peg and tweezers to pick up rice, raisins, stones, seeds and spaghetti. How has the sound changed?
