



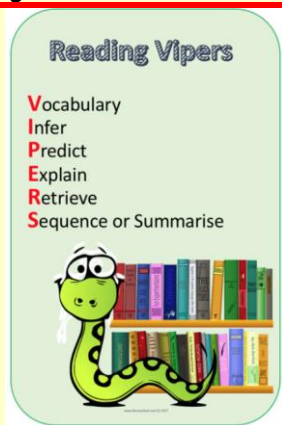

Use your senses to describe a setting

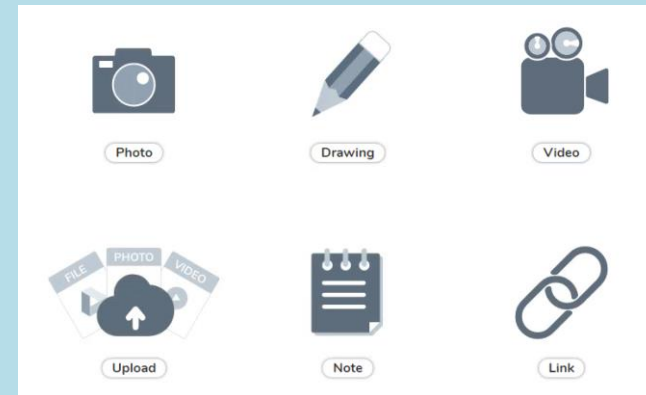

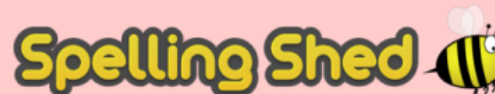

We will be able to see how you are doing as it will send us updates as to what and how much you have read. Happy reading!

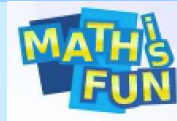

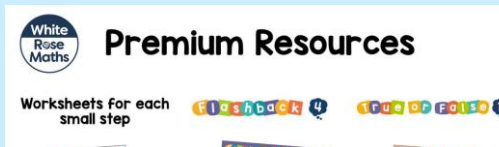
Maths tasks

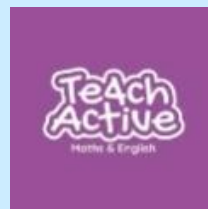

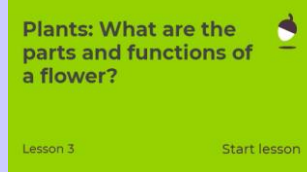
To access your Maths resources, you need to scroll down to Week 8 (15th of June) as we are now a week behind.
