We will be able to see how you are doing as it will send us updates as to what and how much you have read. Happy reading!

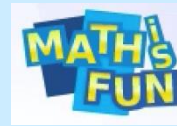

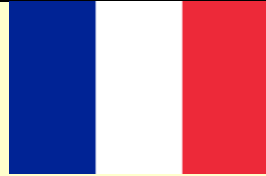
