Declamations

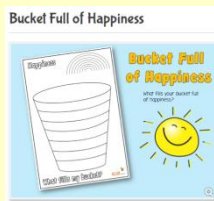

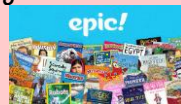
We have pushed our way into 3rd place, however Year 4 and Year 6 are still ahead of us! Keep up the hard work on Spelling Shed.

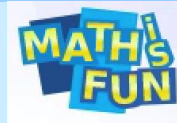

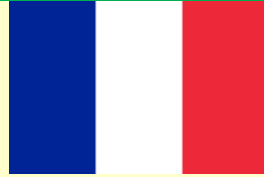

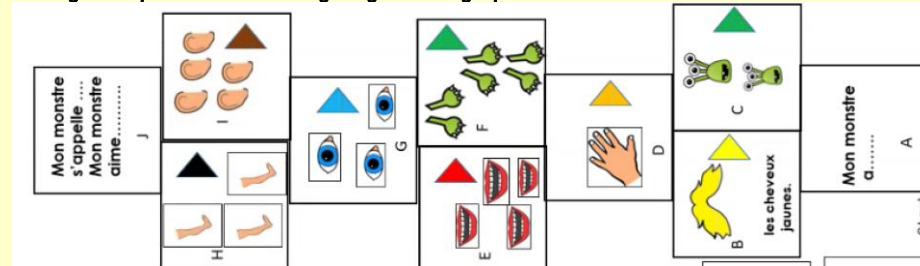

Languages - body parts and colours



Can you practise saying body parts and colours in French?



Play monster hopscotch.

- First play the game on the page with a hand.
- Each square on the grid describes a part of a monster's body.
- Say what you see. Say how many of each body part you can see, the body part and the colour in the triangle.
- Start your sentence for each body part with "Mon monstre a...".
- In the final box you need to give your monster a name and say what things the monster likes.
- Draw your monster.
- Write out the description in French.
- Challenge yourself and add extra colours or even a size too.

Afterwards play the game in your garden or with large pieces of paper to make the hopscotch grid.

You need to turn the page so that you can see the pictures on the grid the right way up.
