English Tasks



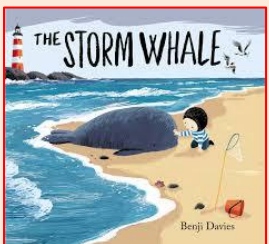
1. **Spelling Shed Activities:** Login on 'Seesaw' and click 'Activities' to access some reading and writing activities featuring 'the long vowel sound /i:/ spelled with a split digraph i-e.'



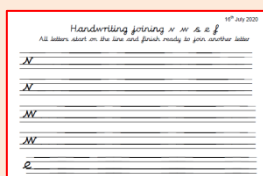
2. **Spelling Shed Spelling Practise:** You can also click on the 'Spelling Shed' logo to take you the website where you can practise this spelling rule online. You will need your 'Spelling Shed' username to access these.



3. **Rising Stars Reading Planet:** ★ You have three new reading books waiting for you on 'Reading Planet'. Just click on the image and this will take you directly to the log-in page. Once you have completed each book, don't forget to complete the quiz to see how many questions you can get correct. It is important that you also click 'finished' at the end. Happy Reading!

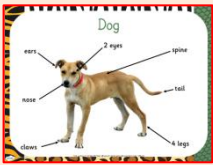

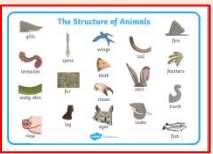
